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

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
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PROGRESSIVE TEACHING TYPE

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The phonemes above are introduced in each teaching type via a dedicated phonics lesson. We recommend teaching these lessons at the start of each appropriate year.

The phonemes are then revisited numerous times in each of the units within the various teaching types. As pupils move through the teaching types, the previous phonemes are consolidated and revised.

As well as a yearly phonics focus, pupils will also encounter other French phonetic concepts as they progress through all 3 teaching types:

-  Liaison
-  The effect of accents
-  Guttural 'R' sound
-  Silent letters
-  'H' aspiré and 'H' muet
-  The tricky French letter 'E'
