






- To design a curriculum where children's spiritual development is enhanced by exploring music from around the world.

Purpose of study

Music is a universal language that embodies one of the highest forms of creativity. A high-quality music education should engage and inspire pupils to develop a love of music and their talent as musicians, and so increase their self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement. As pupils progress, they should develop a critical engagement with music, allowing them to compose, and to listen with discrimination to the best in the musical canon.

National Curriculum in England

Subject Content



Key stage 1 Pupils should be taught to:

- use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes
- play tuned and untuned instruments musically
- listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music
- experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.

Key stage 2:

- Pupils should be taught to sing and play musically with increasing confidence and control. They should develop an understanding of musical composition, organising and manipulating ideas within musical structures and reproducing sounds from aural memory.
- Pupils should be taught to:
- play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression
- improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory use and understand staff and other musical notations
- appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians develop an understanding of the history of music

National Curriculum in England





Here at Hopton Primary School we use a programme of study called Kapow Primary, to ensure our children are give the breath and broad curriculum they require. Kapow Primary has been chosen at it directly aligns with the School's ethos and vision, upholding all that we have identified as learning 'musts' for our children. Kapow is designed first and foremost to help children feel that they are musical and to develop a life long love of music. The programme focus' on developing the skills knowledge and understanding that children need in order to become confident performers, composers and listeners. The curriculum introduces children to music from across around the world and across generations, teaching children to respect and appreciate the music of all traditions and communities.
