
Improve your knowledge of the education sector

Finding a governing body neak you that fits your skills

We will help you with this. We have a list of vacancies and will introduce you to the Chair of Governors and the Head Teacher and help you with a skills audit to get a good match. If it helps, you can observe a governing body meeting before you make a final decision - try it before you buy it!

Initial training

There are number of courses we will encourage you to attend when you first start, including 'where do I start?'. The courses run at various times and locations to help you. Most schools pay into a training package so the courses are free.

Mentoring

We can identify mentors (experienced governors) who will guide and support you, especially in the early stages, while you learn the ropes.

Ongoing Support

The chair of governors will support you to develop as a governor and make sure your skills are utilised to best effect. We can also give you access to the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) programme run by Suffolk County Council. This has a range of courses to develop your skills such as Project Management and Management and Leadership programmes.
